Applied learning is sometimes referred to as 'hands on' or practical learning. There are a number of ways students can engage with this type of training while at school.

Australian School Based Apprenticeships commonly known as ASBAs, incorporates training and paid employment to a secondary student's school curriculum. When an ASBA program is successfully completed, students will gain a nationally recognised qualification as well as their senior school certificate and the possibility of ongoing employment.

Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning commonly referred to as VCAL, like the VCE, is a recognised senior qualification. The VCAL's flexibility enables students to design a study program that suits their interests and learning needs. Students select accredited VCE and Vocational Education and Training (VE&T) modules and units from the following four compulsory strands:

- Literacy and Numeracy Skills
- Work Related Skills
- Industry Specific Skills
- Personal Development Skills

Vocational Education & Training commonly known as VE&T. VE&T enables a secondary student to combine education with training to provide occupational or work-related knowledge and skills. VE&T is generally completed during Years 11 & 12 however some students may start a VE&T program in Year 10. Students can complete a VE&T program as part of their VCE or their VCAL senior school certificates and forms part of recognised pathways to further education and training.
